- 2. Applications for such additional equipment and supplies shall be made through the local defense council of the municipality served by the respective volunteer fire company or first-aid squad.
 - 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

Chairman Ford stated he understood that the bill had not as yet been passed.

President Royal spoke in regards to the bill and also in regards to the "Defense Council" and stated that the rules and regulations as adopted by the "Defense Council" must be lived up.
