Chief Yetter then asked for the floor and said that his company and the fores fire service cooperate together and that Mr. Marons message was to assist us and hopes that the association will do all we can to stop forest fires and that we should foolow out instructions given to us and work and cooperate to gether

Chief Dehn of the Naval hir "tation then spoke on bean lines and that this was the nearest thing to steam and that steam helps to put out fire Chief Dehn tham introduced Specalist F.Ormond from the Mobile Crash Circuit that is putting on a demonstration at the Naval wir station who spoke on the fog nozzle and foam and said he saw big fires put out with foam and that he was glad to have had the opportunity to come here and speak to the Ass.
