Gus Ruser of the Newtonville Fire Company said that they have a 20 acre area on 12th street in Newtonville that they would give to the county for a fire school and training grounds, And that the county should keep this in mind for the future.

Joe Hackney then asked for the floor and said that he has been asked to be chairman of Red Cross Disaster in the County. Red Cross would be notified They would then notify Joe who would follow up and see what the disaster is in what line flood, fire or what it might be and provide shelter or food or what might be needed. Joe said he would like to have the County Association give him assistance when needed.

The chair then spoke of an emblem to put on door or house where there is an invalid to identify the Fire Company or rescue squad that some one in the house has to be taken care off, The person who displays it carries information which should be known to anyone helping him during an accident or sudden illness. This has been offered by the American Medical Association This emblem is called the (Star of Life) Recognizing it as the universal symbol of emergency medical identification will help fire Chief's to locate information that may protect life in an emergency.

The Secretary then presented bill from George Fenwick Printer for \$12.50 for printing 400 tickets for Ladies Night. Upon motion bill be paid.
