Stability-Reactivity, -0-Will not burn, -1-Low Explosive, -2-Medium Explosive, -3-High Explosive, -4-Deadly.

The Following are examples of material wich are common and classes they fall in.

Health Hazzard , -0-Non Toxic (Asphalt) -1-Low Toxic (Gasoline Acetylene) -2-Medium Toxic (Camphor) -4-Deadly (Hydrogen Cynide)

Flammability, -1-Low Flame (Peanut Oil-Olive Oil)
2-Medium Flammability (Fuel Oil-Kerosene) 3(High Flammability)-(Gasoline)
4-Deadly. (National Gas, -Propane, -Acetylene)

Stability, -0-Will not Explode, -(Gasoline), -Asphalt) -4-Deadly-(NitroClycerane-T.N.T. Acetylene).
